6 *Section 47A.* No corporation, individual or as-
7 sociation shall by advertisement, letter, circular, or
8 by employment of agents or otherwise, solicit ap-
9 pointment or employment as executor, administrator,
10 trustee, guardian or conservator.

1 SECTION 2. The supreme judicial court and the
2 superior court shall have concurrent jurisdiction in
3 equity to enforce the foregoing provision.
