By Miss Parker of Lancaster (by request), petition of Henry T. Broderick that institutions supported in whole or in part by public funds be limited as to sources of supply for daily milk requirements under certain conditions. Agriculture and Public Health (sitting jointly).

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Five.

An Act relative to the Purchase and Sale of Milk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter ninety-four of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding at the end of section forty-eight A
3 thereof the following new section:—

4 *Section 48B.* Institutions located within the com-
5 monwealth, supported in whole or in part by public
6 funds, shall be required to purchase for their daily
7 supply, milk produced within the commonwealth,
8 except when the local supply is inadequate or does not
9 conform to state and health standards. Certified
10 milk shall be excluded from the provisions of this act.

Resolved, That the Committee on the subject of the
 proposed amendments to the Constitution of the United States
 be and they are authorized to report to the House of Representatives
 at the next session of Congress the following amendments to the
 Constitution of the United States:

The Constitution of the United States

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 4. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 5. The Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments, when the House of Representatives shall have impeached; and no Officer of the United States shall be tried in their Absence, unless they shall have fled from the Country; and no Person shall be convicted without the Concurrence of two thirds of the Members present.

Section 6. The Senators and Representatives shall receive Compensation for their Services, to be ascertained from Time to Time by each House, and such Compensation shall not be increased during the Term for which they shall be elected.

Section 7. No Senator or Representative shall, during the Time for which he shall be elected, accept any other Title of Office of Profit, but this shall not extend to any other Office which he shall accept at the End of his Term of Office.

Section 8. The Congress shall have Power to lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to pay the Debts and provide for the common Defence and general Welfare of the United States; but all Duties, Imposts and Excises shall be uniform throughout the United States.

Section 9. The Congress shall have Power to regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes; to establish an uniform Rule of Naturalization; to borrow Money on the Credit of the United States; to fix the Standard of Weights and Measures; to coin Money, to regulate the Value thereof, and to make such other Laws as may be necessary and proper to carry into Execution the foregoing Powers, and all other Powers vested by this Constitution in the Congress.

Section 10. No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation; grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal; or coin Money, emit Bills of Credit, or make any Thing but gold and silver Coin legal Tender for Debts; or give Grants of Feudal Tenure, or Titles of Nobility; or grant any Title of Nobility.

Section 11. The Congress shall have Power to declare War, to issue Letters of Marque and Reprisal, and to make Rules concerning Captives on Land and on Water; but no War shall be declared by the President, unless authorized by the Congress, unless in Cases of Imminent Danger, when he may make such Declaration as the Nature of the Case may require.

Section 12. The President and Vice President shall be elected for four Years; and in all Cases, except Impeachment, shall hold Office until they shall be succeeded; but no Person shall be elected President more than twice; and no Person who has held the Office of President, or acted as President, shall be eligible for that Office, either immediately, or in any Capacity whatsoever, after he shall have so acted.

Section 13. The President shall have Power to fill up all Vacancies that may happen during the Term of his Office, by appointing and removing his Officers, with the Advice and Consent of the Senate; but no Appointment shall be made unless the Senate be present.

Section 14. The President shall have Power to grant Reprieves and Pardons for all Offences against the United States, except Impeachments.

Section 15. The President shall have Power to require the Attendance of all Officers of the United States, and to receive Ambassadors and other public Ministers.

Section 16. The President shall have the Power to receive such Ambassadors and other public Ministers as may be presented to him, and to receive the Oath of Office from all Officers of the United States.
