The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Five.

An Act authorizing Workmen's Compensation Insurance by the Commonwealth and Certain Counties, Cities, Towns and Districts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section sixty-nine of chapter one hundred and fifty-
2 two of the General Laws, as amended by section
3 seven of chapter three hundred and eighteen of the
4 acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-three, is hereby
5 amended by adding at the end thereof the following:—

6 It shall be lawful for the commonwealth and for
7 any county, city, town or district as aforesaid to effect
8 insurance against the payment of the compensation
9 provided for by this chapter.
