AN ACT PLACING THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF CHICOPEE UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The office of chief of the fire department of the
2 city of Chicopee shall, upon the effective date of this
3 act, become subject to the civil service laws and rules
4 and regulations relating to permanent members of
5 fire departments of cities, and the tenure of office of
6 any incumbent thereof shall be unlimited, subject,
7 however, to such laws; but the person holding said
8 office on said effective date may continue to serve
9 as such without taking a civil service examination.
