In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Eight.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ENCLOSING OF COAL PITS IN
SOUTH BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 No person shall accumulate, store or keep coal
2 in any pit, pocket, pile or other place in the South
3 Boston district of the city of Boston, and no per-
4 son shall dump or let fall into any such place coal
5 from any railway car, motor vehicle, wagon or other
6 carrier, unless the said place or the said carrier, as
7 the case may be, is effectually enclosed and covered
8 with such material and in such manner that particles
9 of the said coal cannot escape into the surrounding
10 atmosphere to the damage, inconvenience or discom-
11 fort of adjacent householders or industrial workers,
12 or of the general public. All violations of this act
13 shall be punished, upon complaint, by a fine of not
14 more than three hundred dollars.
