AN ACT PERMITTING CERTAIN INSURANCE COMPANIES
TO INSURE PROPERTY OUTSIDE THE COMMONWEALTH
AGAINST ALL RISKS OR HAZARDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Massachusetts General Laws, chapter one hundred
2 and seventy-five, section fifty-four A, inserted by
3 chapter one hundred and sixty-five of the acts of
4 nineteen hundred and thirty-two, is hereby amended
5 by striking out the word "personal", as appearing in
6 said chapter one hundred and sixty-five, so that as
7 amended said section fifty-four A shall read as fol-
8 lows:— *Section 54A.* Any domestic company author-
9 ized to transact any of the kinds of business specified
10 in the second clause of section forty-seven may,
11 outside the commonwealth, make contracts of insur-
12 ance insuring property of any kind or description
13 against any and all risks of loss or damage.
