AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF IPSWICH TO PENSION  
VALORUS H. GRANT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging its  
2 moral obligation the town of Ipswich may pay to  
3 Valorus H. Grant, who, for more than thirty years,  
4 served as a police officer in said town of Ipswich, and  
5 whose health was impaired by faithful attention to  
6 his duties as such, an annual pension, payable weekly,  
7 equal to one half of his annual compensation at the  
8 time of his retirement as such police officer, said pen-  
9 sion to be retroactive to the time that he was last  
10 employed as a police officer by the town of Ipswich.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its ac-  
2 ceptance by a majority of the voters of the town of  
3 Ipswich present and voting thereon at any annual  
4 town meeting called for the purpose within two years  
5 after its passage.
