By Mr. Coakley of Chicopee, petition of the Massachusetts State Firemen's Association relative to retirement of certain call members of fire departments in certain cities and towns. Pensions.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Eight.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF CERTAIN CALL MEMBERS OF FIRE DEPARTMENTS IN CERTAIN CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The last paragraph of section eighty of
2 chapter thirty-two of the General Laws, as most re-
3 cently amended by section eight of chapter one hun-
4 dred and two of the acts of nineteen hundred and
5 thirty-seven, is hereby further amended by inserting
6 before the word "fireman" in the first line the word:
7 — permanent, — so as to read as follows:— No per-
8 manent fireman whose employment begins after June
9 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, shall be
10 subject to the provisions of this section.

1 SECTION 2. Section eighty-five C of said chapter
2 thirty-two, as most recently amended by section nine
3 of said chapter one hundred and two, is hereby fur-
4 ther amended by inserting before the word "fireman"

5 in the first line the word:— permanent, — so as to
6 read as follows:— *Section 85C.* No policeman or
7 permanent fireman whose employment begins after
8 June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven,
9 shall be subject to the provisions of sections eighty-
10 three to eighty-five B, inclusive, or any of them.
