AN ACT RELATING TO PROVISIONS OF LORD'S DAY LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section eight of chapter one hundred and thirty-
2 six of the General Laws, as amended by chapter one
3 hundred and twenty-four of the acts of nineteen
4 hundred and thirty-seven, is hereby amended by
5 striking out said section eight and substituting in
6 place therefor a new section eight, as follows:—

7 *Section 8.* Every license granted under the pre-
8 ceding section shall specify the street, place, number
9 or motor vehicle registration number, and if there is
10 no number, the location of the place of business in
11 which the license is to be exercised, and the license
12 shall not be valid at any other place or in any other
13 vehicle. A license if granted prior to May first in
14 any year shall take effect on that day, but if granted

15 thereafter it shall take effect on the date thereof.
16 Such licenses shall expire on April thirtieth of each
17 year; but they may be granted during April, to take
18 effect on May first following. The fee for such license
19 shall not be more than five dollars a year, and it may
20 be suspended or revoked by the officer or board
21 granting the same.
