AN ACT INCREASING THE NUMBER OF ASSOCIATE JUSTICES OF THE SUPERIOR COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter two hundred and twelve, section one, of
2 the General Laws of the commonwealth (Tercentenary
3 Edition) is hereby amended by striking out the word
4 "thirty-one" in the second line thereof and substitut-
5 ing the word: — forty-one, — so as to read as fol-
6 lows: — The superior court shall consist of one chief
7 justice and forty-one associate justices.
