By Mr. Hillis of Cambridge, petition of William D. Hillis for amendment of the law relative to the sale of alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises. Legal Affairs.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE GRANTING OF LICENSES TO SELL
ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES NOT TO BE DRUNK ON THE
PREMISES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section sixteen A of chapter one hundred and
2 thirty-eight of the General Laws, as most recently
3 amended by section one of chapter four hundred and
4 twenty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and
5 thirty-seven, is hereby further amended by striking
6 out, in the second line, the words "or fifteen", — so
7 that the first sentence will read as follows:— The
8 holder of an annual license under section twelve who
9 applies during the month of November in any licensing
10 period for a license of the same class for the next
11 succeeding licensing period or any former holder of a
12 seasonal license who applies during the month of
13 March for a renewal of a license held during the
14 preceding seasonal licensing period shall be prima
15 facie entitled thereto, if the number of such licenses
16 issuable under section seventeen is not less than the
17 number of such holders or former holders so applying.
