## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Eight.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE ISSUANCE TO NON-RESIDENT UNITED STATES CITIZENS OF SPECIAL FISHING LICENSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section eight of chapter one hundred  
2 and thirty-one of the General Laws is hereby amended  
3 by striking out the paragraph inserted by chapter one  
4 hundred and fifty-six of the acts of nineteen hundred  
5 and thirty-four, and inserting in place thereof the  
6 following:—

7 For a fishing license covering all the inland waters  
8 and good for three consecutive days specified on the  
9 license, one dollar and fifty cents. Said days may be  
10 so specified on the license notwithstanding the provi-  
11 sions of section five of chapter one hundred and twenty-  
12 nine A.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on January  
2 first, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine.
