RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION RELATIVE TO THE ACQUISITION BY THE COMMONWEALTH OF LAND NEAR TRAPP POND IN THE TOWNS OF EDGARTOWN AND OAK BLUFFS FOR PUBLIC BEACH PURPOSES.

1 *Resolved*, That the department of conservation  
2 is hereby authorized and directed to investigate the  
3 subject matter of current house document numbered  
4 thirteen hundred and thirty-one, relative to the  
5 acquisition by the commonwealth of land near  
6 Trapp pond in the towns of Edgartown and Oak  
7 Bluffs for public beach purposes. Said department  
8 shall report to the general court the results of its  
9 investigation, and its recommendations, if any, in-  
10 cluding estimates of cost, and drafts of legislation  
11 necessary to carry said recommendations into effect,  
12 by filing the same with the clerk of the house of repre-  
13 sentatives on or before the first Wednesday of Decem-  
14 ber in the current year.
