RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF THE TOWN OF CHESTER.

1 *Resolved*, That there shall be allowed and paid to
2 the town of Chester out of the treasury of the com-
3 monwealth, subject to appropriation, the sum of six
4 hundred dollars, for the purpose of reimbursing said
5 town for public welfare expenses incurred by it from
6 April, nineteen hundred and thirty-three, to December,
7 nineteen hundred and thirty-five, in giving relief to
8 John B. Boomsma and family who had no settlement
9 in the commonwealth.
