By Mr. Dillon of Cambridge, petition of Hector M. Loudon for legislation to dissolve the corporation known as Library Bureau Mutual Aid Association. Mercantile Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Eight.

AN ACT DISSOLVING LIBRARY BUREAU MUTUAL AID ASSOCIATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Library Bureau Mutual Aid Associa-
2 tion, a Massachusetts corporation incorporated under
3 general law on January first, nineteen hundred and
4 fifteen, is hereby dissolved, subject to the provisions
5 of sections fifty-one and fifty-two of chapter one hun-
6 dred and fifty-five of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed
2 to affect any suit pending by or against said corpora-
3 tion, or any suit now pending or hereafter brought for
4 any liability now existing against the officers of said
5 corporation, or to make valid any defect in the organi-
6 zation of said corporation.

1 SECTION 3. Suits upon choses in action arising out
2 of contracts sold or assigned by said corporation may

3 be brought or prosecuted in the name of the purchaser
4 or assignee. The fact of sale or assignment and of
5 purchase by the plaintiff shall be set forth in the writ
6 or other process; and the defendant may avail himself
7 of any matter of defense of which he might have
8 availed himself in a suit upon the claim by said cor-
9 poration, had it not been dissolved by this act.
