AN ACT MAKING LEWIS D. BALDWIN ELIGIBLE FOR A RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE UNDER THE STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Lewis D. Baldwin, employed by the commonwealth
2 since June twenty-seventh, nineteen hundred and
3 thirty, on the New Bedford-Fairhaven bridge, so
4 called, on which date the commonwealth took over
5 the control and maintenance of said bridge, and who
6 was previously employed by the county of Bristol
7 and by the city of New Bedford on said bridge since
8 June sixteenth, nineteen hundred and one, shall, upon
9 the effective date of this act, become a member of the
10 state retirement system; provided, that he deposits
11 in the annuity fund of said system such amount as
12 the state board of retirement may determine in order
13 to establish an account for him in said annuity fund
14 in an amount equal to that which it would have been
15 if he had become a member of said system on said
16 June twenty-seventh, nineteen hundred and thirty.
17 For the purpose of computing his retirement allow-
18 ance, the entire service of said Lewis D. Baldwin on
19 said bridge shall be counted as state service.
