

To accompany the petition of Philip G. Bowker and Michael LoPresti for legislation to provide unlimited tenure of employment for the incumbent of the position of paying teller in the Department of the State Treasurer. Civil Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING UNLIMITED TENURE OF EMPLOYMENT
FOR THE INCUMBENT OF THE POSITION OF PAYING
TELLER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE TREASURER.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would
2 tend to defeat its purpose, which is in part to provide
3 without delay unlimited tenure of employment for the
4 incumbent of the position referred to therein, there-
5 fore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law,
6 necessary for the immediate preservation of the pub-
7 lic convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 The person employed as paying teller in the de-
2 partment of the state treasurer on the effective date
3 of this act shall become subject to the civil service
4 laws and rules and his tenure of office shall be un-
5 limited, subject, however, to said laws, but he shall
6 be subjected by the division of civil service to a
7 qualifying examination, and upon passing said ex-
8 amination shall be certified for said position and shall
9 be deemed to be permanently appointed thereto with-
10 out being required to serve any probationary period.
