AN ACT RELATING TO CREDITABLE SERVICE UNDER THE
RETIREMENT LAW FOR CERTAIN PERSONS IN ELECTIVE
OR APPOINTIVE POSITIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 For the purpose of making allowance for creditable
2 service under the retirement law those persons who
3 hold unpaid elective or appointive positions in the
4 commonwealth shall be credited with allowable ex-
5 penses provided for by law or regulation and shall be
6 subject to deductions therefrom for the purpose of
7 retirement. Persons holding such elective or ap-
8 pointive positions shall thereafter be eligible for
9 retirement subject to all other provisions of the retire-
10 ment law.

The Commission on the Administration of the State

1. The Commission on the Administration of the State was organized on July 1, 1964, by the Governor of the State of New York. The Commission is composed of the following members:

2. The Commission is authorized to study and report on the organization and administration of the State government, including the executive, legislative, and judicial branches, and the various agencies and departments of the State.

3. The Commission is authorized to hold public hearings and to receive and consider any suggestions or recommendations from any person or organization regarding the organization and administration of the State government.

4. The Commission is authorized to make such investigations and studies as it may deem necessary and appropriate for the purpose of carrying out its duties.

5. The Commission is authorized to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor of the State.

6. The Commission is authorized to make such other and further provisions as may be necessary or appropriate for the purpose of carrying out its duties.

7. The Commission is authorized to employ such personnel as it may deem necessary and appropriate for the purpose of carrying out its duties.

8. The Commission is authorized to receive and accept any gifts or contributions of money or property for the purpose of carrying out its duties.

9. The Commission is authorized to make such other and further provisions as may be necessary or appropriate for the purpose of carrying out its duties.
