## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE TOWNS OF ABINGTON AND  
ROCKLAND MAY SELL WATER TO CERTAIN INHABITANTS  
OF THE TOWN OF HINGHAM.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The towns of Abington and Rockland,  
2 acting through their joint board of water commis-  
3 sioners, as constituted under the provisions of chap-  
4 ter two hundred and six of the acts of eighteen hun-  
5 dred and eighty-five, and with the approval of the  
6 Hingham Water Company may furnish and sell water  
7 to the inhabitants of the town of Hingham residing  
8 along Abington street. The said board of water com-  
9 missioners may supervise such extensions of the water  
10 mains and such installations of other facilities and  
11 equipment within the limits of the town of Hingham  
12 as may be necessary for the purposes of this act;  
13 provided, that such extensions and installations as are  
14 made within the limits of the town of Hingham shall  
15 be subject in all respects to the approval of the select-  
16 men of the town of Hingham.

1 SECTION 2. All costs of installations of facilities  
2 and equipment under the provisions of this act shall  
3 be borne in full by the inhabitants of the town of

4 Hingham residing along Abington Street. The said  
5 board of water commissioners shall maintain and re-  
6 pair such mains.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
