6 in the city of Chelsea, which are approaches and  
7 roads leading to the Soldiers' Home in Massachu-  
8 setts, located in said city. Said department shall  
9 report to the general court the results of its investi-  
10 gation and study and its recommendations, together  
11 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry said  
12 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with  
13 the clerk of the senate on or before the first Wednes-  
14 day of December in the current year.
