AN ACT AUTHORIZING SAVINGS BANKS AND CO-OPERATIVE BANKS TO EXCEED THE LIMITATIONS ON THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT INVESTED IN BANKING QUARTERS WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSIONER.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 53 of chapter 168 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by adding at the end of paragraph 2 the fol-  
3 lowing sentence: — Notwithstanding the provisions of this sec-  
4 tion, a bank may exceed the limits provided for herein with the  
5 approval of the commissioner when the amount so expended is  
6 for the construction of disaster facilities in said real estate.

1 SECTION 2. Section 30 of chapter 170 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by adding at the end of the second paragraph  
3 the following sentence: — Notwithstanding the provisions of this  
4 section, a bank may exceed the limits provided for herein with  
5 the approval of the commissioner when the amount so expended  
6 is for the construction of disaster facilities in said real estate.
