The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR AIRCRAFT UNDER THE CARE, CONTROL AND CUSTODY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND THE OCCUPANTS THEREOF.

1 *Whereas*, the deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to provide immediate and adequate
3 public liability and property damage insurance coverage of the
4 aircraft used, leased or operated by the department of public
5 works and insurance protection to the pilots and passengers of
6 said aircraft; therefore, it is hereby declared an emergency law,
7 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public welfare
8 and convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The department of public works is hereby authorized to pro-
2 vide public liability and property damage insurance for any and
3 all aircraft under its care, custody and control, and to provide
4 accidental death benefits and bodily injury insurance to pilots,
5 employees of the department of public works, all other employees
6 of the commonwealth, members of the general court and any
7 other persons while lawful passengers in said aircraft and while
8 said aircraft is engaged in the service of the commonwealth,
9 within the commonwealth or elsewhere; and for damage to or
10 loss of personal property or state-owned property or equipment;
11 subject to such limitations and restrictions as the commissioner
12 of public works may determine. For the purpose of this act
13 said department may expend such sums as may be necessary
14 therefor in such amounts as the commissioner of public works
15 may determine.

Approved by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the State of New York, January 18, 1887.

The Constitution of the State of New York

In the Year of the Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven

At the City of New York, in the Senate Chamber, on the 17th day of January, 1887, the following resolutions were adopted:

Resolved, That the Governor be and he do cause to be printed and bound in cloth, the Constitution of the State of New York, as amended to the 17th day of January, 1887, and that the same be sold at the rate of one copy for every ten copies of the Constitution of the State of New York, as amended to the 17th day of January, 1887, and that the proceeds of the sale of the same be paid into the Treasury of the State.

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
