### AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE SUSPENSION OF THE OPERATION OF THE LAWS RELATIVE TO THE OBSERVANCE OF THE LORD'S DAY AND LEGAL HOLIDAYS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The state secretary shall cause the following question to be  
2 printed on the official ballot to be used in the cities and towns at  
3 the biennial state election to be held in the current year:—"Shall  
4 the operation of the laws relative to the observance  
5 of the Lord's Day and legal holidays be suspended  
6 during June, July and August in each year?"

7 If a majority of the votes in any county is in the affirmative  
8 the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirty-six of the  
9 General Laws shall thereafter be inoperative in said county dur-
