

By Messrs. Cantwell of Boston, Patrone of Boston and Feeney of Boston, petition of Michael Herbert Cantwell, Charles L. Patrone and Michael Paul Feeney that the Metropolitan District Commission be authorized to convey certain land in the Hyde Park district of the city of Boston to the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post 7421 of Hyde Park, Massachusetts. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO CONVEY CERTAIN LAND IN THE HYDE PARK DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON TO THE VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The metropolitan district commission, for and in behalf of the
2 commonwealth, is hereby authorized and directed to transfer
3 and convey a certain parcel of land, located in the Hyde Park
4 district of the city of Boston, to the Veterans of Foreign Wars,
5 Post 7421 of Hyde Park, Massachusetts, to be used for the
6 erection of a building for post headquarters, bounded and de-
7 scribed as follows:—

8 Northerly by River street thirteen thousand and no hun-
9 dredths (13,000) feet; then easterly by land of the common-
10 wealth of Massachusetts, metropolitan district commission, one
11 hundred and six (106) feet more or less; then southerly by a
12 chain link fence which separates the granted premises from other
13 land of the commonwealth bordering on the Neponset river, one
14 hundred and forty-one (141) feet more or less; and then westerly
15 by the easterly side of Crane street one hundred and fifty-six
16 (156) feet more or less; said land being shown on a plan entitled
17 "Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Metropolitan District Com-
18 mission, Parks Division, Neponset River Reservation, Boston
19 (Hyde Park District), Plan of land on River street to be leased
20 to Veterans of Foreign Wars and Tileston & Hollingsworth,
21 September 21, 1948, Benjamin H. Davis, Director of Park En-
22 gineering," being plan accession number 28121-V.T. on file in
23 the office of the metropolitan district commission.
