The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ASSESSMENT OF CERTAIN CHARGES INCURRED IN THE OPERATION OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Any sums paid to the Metropolitan Transit Authority by
2 the commonwealth on account of a deficiency, together with
3 interest and other charges incurred in borrowing the money
4 therefor, shall be assessed in the following manner: — Seventy-
5 five per cent thereof shall be assessed on the cities and towns
6 constituting the Authority as provided by section twenty of
7 chapter fifty-nine of the General Laws, in proportion to the
8 amounts paid under the last preceding assessment under section
9 fourteen of chapter one hundred and fifty-nine of the special
10 acts of nineteen hundred and eighteen or under section thirteen
11 of chapter five hundred and forty-four of the acts of nineteen
12 hundred and forty-seven, and twenty-five per cent thereof shall
13 be assessed on the following cities and towns contiguous to the
14 territory of cities and towns comprising the Authority, to wit: —
15 Canton, Dedham, Lexington, Melrose, Needham, Quincy,
16 Randolph, Saugus, Stoneham, Wakefield, Waltham, Wellesley,
17 Weston, Winchester and Winthrop, in proportion to the popu-
18 lation of such contiguous cities and towns.
