

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 324

By Mr. Thomson of Swampscott, petition of Eleanor L. Birch that services rendered by teachers in the United States armed forces dependents' schools be considered as creditable service under the teachers retirement system. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

### AN ACT TO ALLOW CREDIT UNDER THE TEACHERS RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR SERVICE AS TEACHERS IN THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES DEPENDENTS' SCHOOLS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Subdivision (4) of section 3 of chapter 32 of the General Laws,  
2 as most recently amended by section 3 of chapter 695 of the acts  
3 of 1955, is hereby further amended by adding at the end the  
4 following paragraph:—

5 For the purpose of retirement under this chapter, the service  
6 of a teacher teaching in the United States armed forces depend-  
7 ents' schools shall be regarded under this subdivision as service  
8 in a public day school, and credit shall be allowed for such service  
9 as provided by this chapter upon payment of the required  
10 amount of money into the annuity savings fund of the teachers  
11 retirement system.

Section 1. The Commission on the Status of Women is hereby created, and its members shall be appointed by the Governor and the Senate, and shall hold office until the expiration of their terms.

### The Commission on the Status of Women

Section 2. The Commission shall have the honor and privilege of being called in and heard by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

Section 3. The Commission shall report to the Senate and the House of Representatives at the first session of the next regular session of the Legislature, and shall also report to the Governor.

Section 4. The Commission shall have the right to hold public hearings and to receive testimony from any person who may wish to appear before it.

Section 5. The Commission shall have the right to call and examine any person who may be necessary to its work, and to receive any information and documents which may be necessary to its work.
