AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE DATES OF TERMINATION OF CERTAIN ACTS RELATING TO THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF VETERANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 708 of the acts of 1941 is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 25, as most recently amended by section 1 of chap-
3 ter 619 of the acts of 1960, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following section:—

5 *Section 25.* Service in the military or naval forces of the
6 United States referred to in this chapter shall, except as other-
7 wise provided thereby, mean such service occurring between
8 January first, nineteen hundred and forty and July first, nine-
9 teen hundred and sixty-five.
