AN ACT TO DIRECT AND AUTHORIZE THE MASSACHUSETTS UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION COUNCIL TO CONSTRUCT A NEW BUILDING IN THE CITY OF LYNN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Massachusetts unemployment compensation
2 council is hereby authorized and directed to construct a new
3 building for the use of the division of employment security in the
4 city of Lynn, out of funds already appropriated and allocated.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Constitution of the Republic
