By Mr. Armstrong of Plymouth, petition of John A. Armstrong for legislation relative to the Board of Registration in Nursing. Public Health.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION IN NURSING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 371 of the acts of 1956 is
2 hereby amended by striking out, in lines 8 and 9, the words
3 "approving authority established by section fifteen A of chapter
4 thirteen of the General Laws" and inserting in place thereof the
5 word: — board.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Constitution of the State

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of members chosen by the electors in each county for a term of four years, one-half of them to be chosen in each year. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the electors in each county for a term of two years, one-half of them to be chosen in each year. The electors shall be qualified electors as defined in section 1 of article 2.

Section 3. The Senate shall have the sole power to impeach and try all officers of the State.
