## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE OPERATION OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of  
2 three members of the senate to be designated by the president  
3 thereof, five members of the house of representatives to be desig-  
4 nated by the speaker thereof, and two persons to be appointed  
5 by the governor, is hereby established for the purpose of mak-  
6 ing an investigation and study relative to the operation of the  
7 Metropolitan Transit Authority. Said commission shall be pro-  
8 vided with quarters in the state house or elsewhere, may hold  
9 public hearings, and shall have the power to summon witnesses  
10 and to require the production of books, records, contracts and  
11 papers and the giving of testimony under oath, and may ex-  
12 pend for legal, clerical and other assistance and expenses such  
13 sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said commission shall  
14 report to the general court the results of its investigation and  
15 study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of  
16 legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect,  
17 by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives  
18 from time to time, but the final report shall be filed not later  
19 than the fourth Wednesday of December, in the current year.

THE CONSTITUTION OF CALIFORNIA

ARTICLE I

Section 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Electors in each State, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
