## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EXAMINATION OF HORSES BROUGHT INTO THE COMMONWEALTH FOR RACING PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,  
2 every horse brought into the commonwealth for purposes of  
3 racing shall be examined by a veterinarian for radioactive con-  
4 tagion and if found to be affected shall be quarantined until  
5 such time as it is found to be free therefrom but shall not, in  
6 any event, be permitted to engage in racing until one week  
7 after its arrival in the commonwealth.
