

HOUSE No. 805

By Mr. Brett of Quincy, petition of Joseph E. Brett that the Metropolitan District Commission be directed to acquire certain land along the Neponset River in the city of Quincy to be used for park purposes. Metropolitan Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN LAND ALONG THE NEPONSET RIVER IN THE CITY OF QUINCY FOR PARK PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission, on behalf
2 of the commonwealth, is hereby authorized and directed to take
3 by eminent domain under the provisions of chapter seventy-nine
4 of the General Laws, or acquire by purchase or otherwise, as
5 part of the system of metropolitan parks under the control of
6 said commission, the marsh land along the Neponset river
7 between Granite avenue and Hancock street in the city of
8 Quincy. For said purposes the said commission may expend
9 such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. The Legislative Power

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each county, chosen by the electors thereof.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Representatives chosen by the electors of the several counties.

Section 4. The Senators and Representatives shall be elected for a term of two years.

Section 5. The electors in each county shall meet on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.

Section 6. The electors shall vote for one Senator and one Representative.

Section 7. The electors shall vote by ballot.
