

HOUSE No. 819

By Mr. Cantwell of Boston, petition of Louis A. Salmon that provisions of the law relative to the annual adjustment of pensions and retirement allowances of public employees be made inapplicable to persons who have reached their sixty-fifth birthday. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE LAW RELATIVE TO THE ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT OF PENSIONS AND RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES SHALL NOT APPLY TO PERSONS WHO HAVE REACHED THEIR SIXTY-FIFTH BIRTHDAY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 91A of chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:
- 3 — The provisions of this section shall not apply to persons who
- 4 have reached their sixty-fifth birthday.
