

By Mr. Reynolds of Worcester (by request), petition of the Associated Fire Fighters of Mass., AFL:CIO, that the Commissioner of Public Safety be directed to establish a state fire academy. Public Safety.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A STATE FIRE ACADEMY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 22 of the General Laws is hereby amended by add-
2 ing after section 14 the following new sections:—

3 *Section 15.* The commissioner of public safety is authorized
4 and directed to establish and administer a technical fire academy
5 to be known as the "State Fire Academy" insofar as funds are
6 made available by the general court; provided, however, that
7 all action taken hereunder shall be with the advice and consent
8 of the fire academy board as established by the following section.

9 *Section 16.* There shall be within the department a fire acad-
10 emy board who shall be appointed by the governor with the
11 advice and consent of the council and who shall serve without
12 compensation comprised of the following:— the commissioner
13 of public safety, ex officio; the president of Fire Chief's Club
14 of Massachusetts, ex officio; the president of the Massachusetts
15 Institute of Fire Department Instructors, ex-officio; the presi-
16 dent of the Associated Firefighters of Massachusetts, AFL:CIO,
17 ex officio; three persons holding the positions of chief of the
18 department in a municipality; and a person experienced in the
19 prevention and control activity.

20 *Section 17.* The commissioner of public safety with the
21 advice and consent of the fire academy board shall determine
22 the location and the curriculum of the academy and the quali-
23 fications of the instructors serving therein as well as all other
24 matters pertaining to its establishment and administration.

25 *Section 18.* The initial appointments of the members of the
26 fire academy board, as provided in the preceding section, ex-
27 cept the ex officio members, shall be for one, two and three years,
28 respectively, and thereafter for terms of three years.
