AN ACT RESTRICTING THE USE OF AN OTTER TRAWL IN CERTAIN WATERS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The use of an otter trawl is hereby restricted from sunset to
2 sunrise in so much of the territorial waters of the commonwealth
3 as lie between a line drawn from Gay Head light to Cuttyhunk
4 light and a line drawn from Monomoy to Great Point, Nan-
5 tucket.

6 Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine of
7 not less than five hundred dollars nor more than one thousand
8 dollars.

THE KANSAS CONSTITUTION

Article I. Section 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives, which shall meet on the first Monday of January next following the election of the President and Vice President, and thereafter on the first Monday of January in every second year, unless they shall assemble on some other day, which day shall be determined by law.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or excluded from this Union according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, (including Indians bound to Service) three fifths of all other Persons who are held as Servants or Apprentices under the Laws of the said State, and who are not enumerated in the foregoing Clause, but excluding all Indians not taxed.

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
