RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR A STUDY RELATIVE TO PUBLIC STATE AND MUNICIPAL SHELTERS FROM NUCLEAR BLAST OR FALLOUT.

1 *Resolved*, that an unpaid special commission consisting of one
2 member of the senate to be designated by the president thereof,
3 two members of the house of representatives to be designated
4 by the speaker thereof, the commissioner of public safety or his
5 designee, the commissioner of public health or his designee, the
6 commissioner of education or his designee, the commissioners of
7 correction and mental health or designees, the director of civil
8 defense and two persons appointed by the governor, be hereby
9 established to study the matter of providing state and mu-
10 nicipal shelters for the protection of the public from nuclear
11 fallout and/or blast in or near public buildings and in other
12 suitable places, including provisions for the continued function-
13 ing of state and local governments, and of the financing thereof.
14 Said commission shall be provided with quarters in the State
15 House, shall hold one or more public hearings and shall report its
16 findings, together with drafts of legislation to carry out the same
17 to the house of representatives not later than March fifteen,
18 nineteen hundred and sixty-two.
