AN ACT RELATIVE TO PAYMENT OF ACCUMULATED VACATION OR SICK LEAVE ALLOWANCE OF STATE EMPLOYEES UPON DEATH OR SEPARATION FROM SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 31A of chapter 29 of the General Laws, as most re-
- 2 cently amended by chapter 680 of the acts of 1954, is hereby
- 3 further amended by adding the following new subsection (d):—
- 4 (d) Upon the death or retirement of an officer or employee
- 5 who is eligible for sick leave under the rules and regulations of
- 6 said city or town, payment of unused sick leave credits shall be
- 7 made on the basis of one day for each two days of accumulated
- 8 sick time. Payments shall be made in the same manner as pre-
- 9 scribed in subsections (a), (b) and (c).
