## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

### AN ACT GRANTING TENURE OF OFFICE TO CERTAIN MEDICAL EXAMINERS AND ASSOCIATE MEDICAL EXAMINERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 38 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-  
2 serting after section 1 the following section:—

3 *Section 1A.* Upon completion of a seven-year term, medical  
4 examiners and associate medical examiners, if reappointed,  
5 shall hold their offices during good behavior; provided, never-  
6 theless, that the governor with the consent of the council after  
7 due notice and hearing may retire them because of mental or  
8 physical disability.
