AN ACT TO FURTHER DEFINE "COMMERCIAL VEHICLES".

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Commercial vehicles as defined excluding them from certain
- 2 metropolitan district commission roads or other highways which
- 3 exclude such vehicles shall not include so-called station wagons,
- 4 suburban models, and sedan delivery type vehicles within the
- 5 definition of said commercial vehicles.
