AN ACT TO REQUIRE LIGHTS ON THE REAR OF ALL TRAILERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 7 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended, is
2 hereby further amended by striking out the eighth sentence and
3 substituting therefor the following sentence:— Every motor
4 vehicle or trailer so operated shall have a rear light so placed as to
5 show a red light from behind and also a white light so arranged
6 as to illuminate and not obscure the rear register number.
