AN ACT RELATIVE TO COURT HOUSE FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 34 of the General Laws, as most recently amended,
2 is further amended by inserting after section 3 thereof the
3 following new section:—

4 *Section 3A.* In any court room in the commonwealth in
5 which criminal trials are conducted before juries, the cages
6 therein shall be forthwith removed and docks supplied in their
7 stead.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I
Section 1
All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2
The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

Section 3
The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have the Qualifications requisite for Senators of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
