## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

### AN ACT DESIGNATING A CERTAIN SQUARE IN THE CITY OF CHELSEA AS MANUEL J. WEINER SQUARE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission is hereby  
2 authorized and directed to redesignate the intersection of Web-  
3 ster and Garfield avenues and the Revere Beach parkway in the  
4 city of Chelsea as Manuel J. Weiner Square in memory of  
5 Manuel J. Weiner, a deceased veteran of World War II and to  
6 place at said circle a suitable tablet or marker bearing said desig-  
7 nation, due to the fact that the former traffic circle at that lo-  
8 cation bearing said deceased veteran's name has been eliminated  
9 by the metropolitan district commission in the widening and  
10 improvement of said parkway.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter seventeen of the acts of nineteen hun-  
2 dred and forty-eight is hereby repealed.

The Constitution of the State

Section 1. The Executive Power shall be vested in the Governor.

Section 2. The Governor shall have the honor and the power of pardon, and may grant reprieves and commutations of punishment, and may remit the whole or any part of the punishment inflicted by the laws of this State, and may suspend the execution of the laws, until he shall see fit to remove the suspension.

Section 3. The Governor shall be elected by the people for a term of four years, and shall hold office until the first day of January next after the day of his election.

Section 4. The Governor shall be elected by the people at a general election, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 5. The Governor shall have the honor and the power of pardon, and may grant reprieves and commutations of punishment, and may remit the whole or any part of the punishment inflicted by the laws of this State, and may suspend the execution of the laws, until he shall see fit to remove the suspension.

Section 6. The Governor shall be elected by the people at a general election, and shall be eligible for re-election.

Section 7. The Governor shall have the honor and the power of pardon, and may grant reprieves and commutations of punishment, and may remit the whole or any part of the punishment inflicted by the laws of this State, and may suspend the execution of the laws, until he shall see fit to remove the suspension.

Section 8. The Governor shall be elected by the people at a general election, and shall be eligible for re-election.
