**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF CERTAIN REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. In a city or town wherein the assessed valuation of  
2 real estate of a person entitled to a two thousand dollar exemp-  
3 tion, under the provisions of chapter fifty-nine of the General  
4 Laws, shall be increased, said person shall receive a tax exemp-  
5 tion of six thousand dollars; provided said real estate is occupied  
6 by said person and is assessed for not more than twenty-five  
7 thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. In a city or town wherein the assessed valuation of  
2 real estate of a person entitled to a three thousand or four  
3 thousand dollar tax exemption, under the provisions of chapter  
4 fifty-nine of the General Laws, shall be increased, said person  
5 shall receive a tax exemption of nine thousand dollars; provided  
6 said real estate is occupied by said person and is assessed for  
7 not more than twenty-five thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 3. In a city or town wherein the assessed valuation  
2 of real estate of a disabled veteran who has suffered the loss of  
3 both feet shall be increased, said veteran shall receive a tax  
4 exemption for the full amount of the assessed valuation; pro-  
5 vided, however, that said veteran shall occupy said property and  
6 that said property shall be assessed for not more than fifty  
7 thousand dollars.
