AN ACT AUTHORIZING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF DRAINAGE AND THE RELIEF OF FLOOD CONDITIONS IN FURNACE BROOK AND BLACK'S CREEK IN THE CITY OF QUINCY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 For the purpose of administering the provisions of chapter
2 five hundred and sixty of the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-
3 eight, there is hereby appropriated from the state treasury for
4 the fiscal year beginning July first, nineteen hundred and sixty-
5 two, the sum of three hundred thousand dollars.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. The Legislature

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives, which shall be styled the Legislature of the State.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of twelve members, who shall be elected by the qualified electors of the State, for a term of four years, and shall hold office until the next meeting of the Senate.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen by the qualified electors of the State, for a term of two years, and shall hold office until the next meeting of the House.

Section 4. The Legislature shall assemble annually on the first Monday in January, and shall continue its session until the first Monday in March, unless it adjourns sooner.

Section 5. The Legislature shall have the sole power of initiating and passing bills, resolutions, and joint resolutions, and shall have the power to amend or repeal any law passed by it.

Section 6. The Legislature shall have the power to impeach and remove any officer of the State, and to elect a successor.

Section 7. The Legislature shall have the power to create, alter, or abolish any office, and to determine the duties and powers of any officer.

Section 8. The Legislature shall have the power to appropriate money, and to determine the mode and manner of its disbursement.

Section 9. The Legislature shall have the power to grant pardons, and to commute any sentence of imprisonment.

Section 10. The Legislature shall have the power to grant reprieves, and to pardon any crime.

Section 11. The Legislature shall have the power to grant commutations, and to pardon any crime.
