AN ACT PLACING THE POSITIONS OF REGULAR OR PERMANENT MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF NORTH READING UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The positions of regular or permanent members,
2 employees of the public works department of the town of North
3 Reading shall, upon the effective date of this act, be subject to
4 the civil service laws and rules relative to employees of the
5 public works department in towns, and the tenure of office of
6 any incumbent thereof shall be unlimited, subject, however, to
7 said laws. The incumbent of each such position on said effective
8 date shall be subjected to a qualifying examination for such
9 position by the division of civil service, and, if he or she passes
10 said examination, shall be certified for said position and shall be
11 deemed to be permanently appointed thereto without being re-
12 quired to serve any probationary period.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for acceptance to the
2 voters of the town of North Reading at the annual town meet-
3 ing in the current year in the form of the following question,
4 which shall be placed upon the official ballot to be used for the
5 election of town officers at said meeting: — “Shall an act passed
6 by the general court in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-two,
7 entitled ‘An Act placing the regular or permanent members and
8 employees of the public works department of the town of North
9 Reading under the civil service laws’, be accepted? If a ma-
10 jority of the votes in answer to said question is in the affirma-
11 tive, this act shall thereupon take full effect, but not otherwise.
