**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE CHIEF JUSTICE AND THE JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME JUDICIAL AND SUPERIOR COURTS, AND JUDGE AND ASSOCIATE JUDGES OF THE LAND COURT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 211 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out section 22 and inserting in place thereof  
3 the following section: —

4 *Section 22.* The chief justice of the court shall receive a sal-  
5 ary of thirty-one thousand five hundred dollars and each asso-  
6 ciate justice a salary of thirty thousand five hundred dollars, and  
7 the chief justice and each associate justice shall annually receive  
8 from the commonwealth, upon certificate of the chief justice, the  
9 amount of the expenses incurred by them in the discharge of  
10 their duties. Such justices shall devote their entire time during  
11 ordinary business hours to their respective duties and shall not,  
12 directly or indirectly, engage in the practice of law.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 212 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by striking out section 27 and inserting in place thereof  
3 the following section: —

4 *Section 27.* The chief justice shall receive a salary of twenty-  
5 eight thousand five hundred dollars and each associate justice  
6 a salary of twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars and the  
7 chief justice and each associate justice shall annually receive  
8 from the commonwealth, upon the certificate of the chief jus-  
9 tice, the amount of the expenses incurred by them in the dis-

10 charge of their duties and shall not, directly or indirectly, engage  
11 in the practice of law.

1 SECTION 3. Section 14 of chapter 185 of the General Laws, is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting  
3 in place thereof the following sentence: — The judge and asso-  
4 ciate judges of the land court shall each receive a salary of  
5 twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars and each shall an-  
6 nually receive, upon the certificate of the judge, the amount of  
7 expenses incurred by him in the discharge of his duties, to be  
8 paid by the commonwealth.
