AN ACT REQUIRING ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR CITY CLERKS
SERVING AS CLERKS OF BOARDS OF ALDERMEN AND CITY COUNCILS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby amended by insert-
2 ing after section 13B, inserted by chapter 139 of the acts of 1954,
3 the following new section: —
4 *Section 13C.* Notwithstanding the provisions of section thirty-
5 three A of chapter forty-four, any other general or special law,
6 or any ordinance of a city to the contrary, any city clerk who is
7 required by law or ordinance to serve as clerk of the board of
8 aldermen or of the city council shall be paid, in addition to such
9 other compensation to which he may be entitled, the sum of
10 one thousand dollars per annum for such service.

The Government of the District

In Case of the District Government

1. The Government of the District is hereby established in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 1st of March, 1873.
2. The District Government shall consist of a Governor and a Council of five members.
3. The Governor shall be appointed by the President of the United States.
4. The Council shall be appointed by the President of the United States.
5. The Governor shall have the honor and power of a Governor of a State.
6. The Council shall have the honor and power of a Council of State.
7. The Governor and Council shall have the same powers and duties as the Governor and Council of a State.
