By Mr. Marr of Lynn, petition of the Associated Fire Fighters of Mass. AFL:CIO for increasing the minimum annual compensation for fire fighters in certain cities and towns. Public Service.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT INCREASING THE MINIMUM ANNUAL COMPENSATION FOR FIRE FIGHTERS IN CERTAIN CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 108D of chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:—

3 *Section 108D.* Notwithstanding the provisions of any gen-
4 eral or special law to the contrary, the minimum annual com-
5 pensation of each fire fighter, permanently employed, in the fire
6 department of any city or town, except one who by virtue of
7 section twenty D of chapter thirty-one is not regarded as hold-
8 ing employment, shall be not less than six thousand three hun-
9 dred dollars.

10 This section shall become effective when accepted in a city
11 having a plan E charter by the affirmative vote of a majority of
12 all the members of the city council, subject to the provisions of
13 the charter, and in a town by a majority vote at a town meeting.
