AN ACT PROVIDING THAT ALL "BREAKAGE" BE PAID TO THE BETTOR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 5 of chapter 128A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the sixth paragraph and substituting
3 the following new paragraph:—

4 All of the odd cents over any multiple of one cent of winnings
5 per dollar wagered shall be paid to the bettor. Such odd cents
6 in this chapter shall be called the "breaks."

The Constitution of the State

In the Year of the Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Two

At a Session of the General Assembly, convened at the City of Albany, on the 15th day of January, 1862, the following

Resolved, That the following be the Constitution of the State of New York, to be in force from and after the first day of January, 1862.

Section 1. The State of New York shall be a free and independent State, free from all external domination, and free from all internal oppression.

Section 2. The Executive Power shall be vested in a Governor, who shall hold his Office for four Years, and be eligible for a second Term.

Section 3. The Legislative Power shall be vested in a Senate and an Assembly, who shall hold their Offices for two Years, and be eligible for a second Term.

Section 4. The Judicial Power shall be vested in a Chief Justice, and such other Justices as may be appointed by the Senate and Assembly.
