AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF DAMAGES TO CERTAIN ABUTTERS INCURRED BY THEM AS A RESULT OF THE FAILURE TO KEEP IN REPAIR A SEA WALL IN THE TOWN OF HULL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation of the
2 commonwealth the state treasurer shall, subject to an appropria-
3 tion therefor, pay to the following abutters the following sums
4 for damage to their property which occurred during the storms
5 of March and December, nineteen hundred and sixty, and Jan-
6 uary, nineteen hundred and sixty-one, because of the failure of
7 the commonwealth to keep the sea wall in front of the said
8 property in good and sufficient repair to protect the lives and
9 property of the abutters:— Henry M. and Pauline Stevenson,
10 28 Channel street, Hull, twenty-five hundred dollars; Anna
11 Lewenberg, 30 Channel street, Hull, thirty-five hundred dollars;
12 Marian Kelly, 32 Channel street, Hull, four thousand dollars;
13 and Charles F. and Grace M. Oberhauser, 34 Channel street,
14 Hull, seventy-five hundred dollars.
